
BSOP Mentorship Program - Bird Nest Spruce Study Group

Library Report

As you know, BSOP has an extensive lending library. It is well used, and we appreciate everyone's cooperation with all the changes we have made lately. We just finished another inventory, and found a few more areas that need work. One problem was getting the whole library up from the basement – it was just too big. So, a number of old, unused items have been purged and it is a little more manageable size. Some library statistics:

- There are currently 260 items, consisting of books, magazines, VHS tapes and DVDs.
- We "lost" 31 items since our inventory in the Fall of 2008.
- There are currently 83 items checked out; 38 are due back in January and 45 are past due.
- Of those past due, 18 items are over 6 months past due; 11 have been out over a year.

One concern is the number of lost items, those taken without proper check out that have not yet been returned. To correct this, we ask that in the future you see the Librarian for check out. Also, the library will now be open between 6:30 and 7:00 and for a short time after the program ends, but it will be closed during the programs. This will help keep the noise level down and allow the Librarian to attend the program.

The number of over due items is an ongoing problem. Remember, books are due back by the NEXT meeting or as soon thereafter as possible. Once again, we ask that you please check your personal stack of reference material for BSOP property. To help find the missing items there will be a list of overdue books at the Librarian's table. Please check to see if your name is on the list. If you have a library item and can't get to the next meeting or two, give us a call. We can help get things back.

Also, we are looking for new items. We accept donations of current books and videos, and are trying to fill in the blanks in our magazine subscriptions. Check with the Librarian to find out what is needed. Also, we have funds available for purchase of new items. If you have read a new book seen a new video recently that you think may be of interest to other club members, please let us know.

Finally, we could use your help. If you can volunteer a few minutes before or after the meetings, we can use you. The library is a great BSOP resource. If you haven't taken advantage of it yet, check us out at the January meeting.


